

Well this is another treasure of a book that I totally love. There are designs from Mayan, Native American as well as Chinese, Finnish and European weavings that are adapted over to various needlepoint stitches. A really great way to learn why and how to get various stitches to look like houndstooth, check, plaids etc. Lovely book and very inspirational.

I have been haunting 's used book section looking for charted designs to use in mosaic/intarsia/stranded knitting, embroidery, cross stitch, needlepoint, and bead weaving. My search is over. The subtitle of this book is "an international collection" and it lives up to that moniker. The charts are for large and detailed projects and will need to be enlarged. They are readable but I like the charts to be extra large for my aging eyes. I think bead weavers would really like some of these projects. They are sophisticated, and some quite complex. There are 63 projects with accompanying charts. There is not much basic info about stitches, etc. It's just charts charts charts. Chapters: intro The Basics pps 15-27 materials, following the graphs, designing your own canvas, on symmetry, blocking, finishing, the stitches.
